

- Critical to the success of the tournament
- Player support
- Problem Solvers
- Face of the Charles Schwab Cup Championship





NEW FOR 2020



- Limited Spectators
- Rope & Stake
- Posts on each hole
 - Adjacent instead of on the tee box (Marshals are not permitted on the tee box)
 - Landing Areas
 - Putting Green
 - Post locations may vary by hole
- Fewer Marshals needed throughout the golf course
- Marshals to social distance





- Practice Area: Phoenix Country Club Driving Range. This area is managed by practice area committee
- On-Course Marshals: Tee Box, Landing Areas, and Putting Green
- Hand signals
 - First Aid/Safety
 - Crowd control
 - Ball direction



TEE BOX



- Make unobstructed path to tee box
- Crowd control
 - Be mindful of crowd activity (volunteers, staff, vendors, etc.)
 - Use best judgement
 - Position yourself correctly, FACE THE CROWD, raise hands, quiet crowd
- Be mindful of other greens, tee boxes, players in surrounding area
- Designate marshal to signal to landing area marshals



LANDING AREA



- Locate errant tee shots
- Crowd control
 - Be mindful of crowd activity (volunteers, staff, vendors, etc.)
 - Use best judgement
 - Position yourself correctly, FACE THE CROWD, raise hands, quiet crowd
- Pay attention to ball flight and landing in the rough; mark with flags
- Do nothing if ball is in fairway
- Out of bounds



PUTTING GREEN



- Crowd control
 - Be mindful of crowd activity (volunteers, staff, vendors, etc.)
 - Use best judgement
 - Position yourself correctly, FACE THE CROWD, raise hands, quiet crowd
- Be mindful of your position near the green, do not interfere with line of sight
- Locate wayward shots off green





- Pathway to Posts: With minimal rope and stake, we ask volunteers to be more mindful of their path to and from their posts throughout the day
- **Evacuation:** Players and caddies will use pre-staged golf carts
- **Crosswalks:** Crosswalks will be throughout the course
- **On-course rulings:** NOT OUR JOB
- Work shifts: Hole Captains to provide schedules, show-up times, quitting times; allow sufficient time to arrive at your hole on time





- Pre-play meetings on each hole: hole captains to schedule and convene, near <u>but not on</u> tee box or green: be on time
- Playoff on Sunday:
 - Playoff Holes: 18, 18, 17, 18
 - Contact Hole Captains before departing on Sunday
